

2013 MAYLA – Boys SELECT League Rule Variations

Time-Outs	1 Per Half & Clock Runs (No TOs in last 5 minutes of 4th quarter)	2 Per Half Clock Stops
Half-Time	5 Minutes	10 Minutes (unless coaches agree to shorten)
Substitutions	Normal with Horn	Normal with Horn
Penalty Enforcement	Time & 1/2 (Penalty clock starts after play is resumed)	Normal Length
Scheduling	60-65 Minutes Apart	90-95 Minutes Apart
Goal Differential	N/A	10 Differential, clock doesn't stop (even on a time out)
Overtime	Yes, 4 minute quarters played to Sudden Victory. No ties.	Yes, 4 minute quarters played to Sudden Victory. No ties.

Rules Differences	Junior Select	Senior Select
One-Handed Checks	<u>Not Allowed</u> , one-handed check will be considered a slash	Only Allowed with legal contact If legal contact isn't made, it is a slash
Goalie Penalties	In-Home can serve, but only if no back-up is ready to play	
Goalie Penalties (Unsportsmanlike Contact)	In-Home can serve if no back-up is ready. But Goalie is done for the day or the next game, whichever is longer. Otherwise, Goalie Serves Penalty.	
Loose Ball Play	3 Yards	
Fouling Out	4 Minutes of Personal Fouls.	
Ejection	A Player is ejected from the game when involved in fighting or when the player has fouled out. Game ejection results in a one game suspension. Note that fouling out from accrued personal foul time partly due to an illegal stick will not be considered an ejection.	
Game Reports	Any game ejection of a player or a coach shall be communicated to MAYLA within 24 hours by the Referee following the conclusion of the game.	

- Officials to meet with both Head Coaches - 10 minutes prior to the start of the contest.
 - Make sure everyone understands the rule variations
 - Certify both coaches at this time
- Spectators – Minimum of 6 yards away from field (on opposite side of the field when available). No end-line spectating.
- No Mercy Rule on Faceoffs.
- Focus is to be provided to Good Sportsmanship and Sideline Behavior. Unruly spectators, identified by Referee will be asked to leave the premises by the respective Team's head coach, or an Unsportsmanlike Penalty shall be assessed to the head coach and served by the In-Home.
- Focus will be given to illegal body blows, slashes, and cross-checks to the head and will result in a minimum 2 to 3 minute, non-releasable personal foul
